Council considered Resolution 2022-11-2 Pay and Benefits for Justin Agan in the Public Works Department. Beginning wage of \$21 an hour, 40 hours of vacation time and benefits per employee handbook. Motion by Uhlenkamp, seconded by Tiefenthaler. Roll call vote. All voted Aye Resolution 2022-11-3 Approving Street Finance Report. Council reviewed the annual Street Finance report. Motion to approve by Pietig, seconded by Riesberg. All voted aye.

Council discussed possibility of utility rate increases. Council decided to table discussion until city clerk Martin returns from Municipal Energy Association of Nebraska board meeting November 16 and 17th. Council will revisit during December council meeting.

Report was given from City Clerk Martin on sales and expenditures for the pool just for during the pool season.
